

CANTERBURY AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND CHEMICAL-MANURE AND ACID WORKERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Canterbury and Otago and Southland Chemical-manure and Acid Workers' award, dated the 14th day of March, 1947, and recorded in 47 Book of Awards 321.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 9 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum rates of wages shall be as follows:—

(2) By deleting clause 11 (Increase in Rates of Remuneration).
