

NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL AND PASTORAL ASSOCIATIONS, RACECOURSE, AND SPORTS BODIES' EMPLOYEES.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Northern Industrial District Agricultural and Pastoral Associations, Racecourse, and Sports Bodies' Employees' award, dated the 3rd day of October, 1941, and recorded in 41 Book of Awards 1336.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 4th day of May, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting clauses 2, 6, and 8, and substituting therefor the following clauses:—

“ Any worker in charge of four or more other workers shall be paid an additional 2d. per hour.

“ Work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with a minimum of three hours.”

“ *Wages*

“ 8. The minimum rate of pay shall be 3s. 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour : Provided that the minimum payment on any one day shall be three hours' pay.”

(2) By deleting clause 10, and substituting therefor the following clause :—

“ *Exclusion from Operation of General Orders*

“ 10. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall *not* be subject to the provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.

CANTERBURY TILE-LAYERS.—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942; and in the matter of the Canterbury Tile-layers' award, dated the 16th day of August, 1938, and recorded in '38 Book of Awards 2192.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Emergency Regulations 1942, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 15th day of August, 1947, doth hereby order as follows:—

1. That the said award (as amended by order of the Court dated the 19th day of September, 1945) shall be further amended in the manner following:—

(1) By deleting subclause (a) of clause 3 (Wages), and substituting therefor the following subclause:—

“(a) The minimum rate of pay for adult outside tile-fixers shall be 3s. 7d. per hour and for adults employed on tile surrounds and slabs shall be 3s. 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour.”

(2) By deleting clause 4, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ *Youths*

“ 4. Youths may be employed at not less than the following rates of wages:—

“ Provided that a worker of the age of twenty-one years or upwards shall be paid not less than the basic wage for the time being prevailing.”

(3) By deleting clause 7, and substituting therefor the following clause:—

“ 7. The following shall be the minimum rates of wages:—

“ Assistants	3 3 $\frac{3}{4}$
“ Labourers	3 2

“ A journeyman shall mean a worker who has worked five years at his trade.”

(4) By inserting, after clause 7 (Wages), the following new clause :—

“ Exclusion from Operation of General Orders

“ 7A. The rates of remuneration provided for in this award shall *not* be subject to the provisions of the two general orders of the Court made under the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, and dated the 9th August, 1940, and the 31st March, 1942, respectively.”

2. That this order shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
