NORTHERN, WELLINGTON, NELSON, AND CANTERBURY CANISTER-WORKERS—AMENDMENT OF AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand.—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952; and in the matter of the Northern, Wellington, Nelson, and Canterbury Canister-workers award, dated the 30th day of November 1951, and recorded in 51 Book of Awards 2081.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Economic Stabilization Regulations 1952, and of every other power in that behalf thereunto enabling it, this Court, for the purpose of giving effect to the pronouncement made by it on the 12th day of July 1952, doth hereby order as follows:—

- 1. That the said award shall be amended in the manner following:
- (1) By deleting subclauses (a), (b), and (h) of clause 3 (Wages) and substituting the following subclauses:—
- " (a) The minimum rate of pay for adult male canister makers and repairers shall be 4s. $7\frac{3}{4}$ d. per hour."
 - "(b) The minimum weekly wage for junior males shall be as follows:—
