

**GISBORNE BOROUGH COUNCIL LABOURERS—AMENDMENT OF INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, and the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953; and in the matter of the Gisborne Borough Council Labourers Industrial Agreement, dated the 13th day of April 1955, and recorded in 55 Book of Awards 409.

UPON reading the application made by the Poverty Bay General Labourers Industrial Union of Workers party to the Gisborne Borough Council Labourers Industrial Agreement, dated the 13th day of April 1955, the Court in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on it by regulation 4 of the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953 and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said industrial agreement shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting subclauses (a) to (m) of clause 8 (Rates of Wages) and substituting therefor the following:

“8. The minimum rates of wages shall be as follows:	Per Week

(2) By deleting clause 11 and substituting therefor the following:

*“Increase in Rates of Remuneration*

11. The rates of remuneration determined by subclauses (a) to (m) of clause 8 shall be increased to the extent and in the manner prescribed by the general order of the Court made under the Economic Stabilisation Regulations 1953 and dated the 26th day of October 1956.”

2. That this order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of November 1956.
