SIR,—As we have been led to apprehend that an impression prevails very generally amongst Official Functionaries and others, that the local examination of the Public Accounts has been conducted on principles unnecessarily strict and minute, we have the honor to forward, for the consideration of His Excellency the Governor, the accompanying Extracts from Queries received from the Commissioners of Audit in England; and, as we are of opinion that if publicity be given to them, it may tend to insure a greater degree of accuracy and attention to points of detail, we beg to recommend that His Excellency the Governor will authorize their being published in the Government Gazette.
