Property Rate Office, Auckland, 18th February, 1845.

QUARTER'S Rate under the provisions of the Property Ordinance, having become due on the 1st instant, the attention of the Public is drawn to the following Section of that Ordinance :--

"12. If any Rate or Composition payable on any of the atoresaid Quarter days, shall remain in arrear for the space of one calendar month, or upwards, such Rate or Composition shall thereupon and thereafter be increased onefourth part thereof for every calendar month for which it shall have been in arrear,"

SUPREME COURT.
