### JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

Monday, 2nd November, 1846. PRESENT:

All the Members.

The Council met pursuant to adjournment. The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and confirmed.

On motion of Mr. Domett, the order of the day for the further consideration in committee of Administration of Justice Bill resumed.

Bill considered, further amended, and ad-

journed until Tuesday, 3rd November, 1846. On motion of the Colonial Treasurer, the Appropriation Bill further considered in committee, amended, and reported.

The Governor laid on the table a Bill to amend the Customs' Amendment Ordinance, Session 3, No. 6.

The Governor laid on the table the following Returns, moved for by Mr. Donnelly on and confirmed. the 21st October.

1.-Return of Revenue of the Government of New Zealand from the commencement of the Colony, to the end of the year 1845.

2.—Return of Revenue of the Northern journed. Division of the Colony of New Zealand, during the Quarter ending 30th September, 1846.

3.-Return of the Number of Ships or Vessels registered or licensed at the Port of Auckland, from the foundation of the Colony.

Ordered, that said Returns be printed.
