The following bearings mark the position of the buoy:—

- Extreme of South Head of harbour entrance in line with another inside point: S. 70° W. (mag.).
- Wairahi Point: N. 2° E. (mag.).
- Red Point: S. 12° E. (mag.).

Removal of Prohibition of Money-order and Postal Correspondence for Scott and Martindale, William Scott, and Harry Martindale, Wellington.
