REGULATION.

19. FEES for licenses shall be paid to the Department according to the following scale per annum :—

For each vessel or boat plying for hire : 2s. 6d. per annum.  
For each master, boatman, or waterman : 1s. per annum.

Every mechanically propelled boat shall be allowed one dinghy not exceeding 12 ft. in length, and the name of the licensed vessel shall be clearly painted on such dinghy. All other rowing-boats employed for hire or as ferry or as watermen's boats shall be licensed as above.
