Northern District Saddlers, Harness, and Bag Makers.—Recommendation of Conciliation Council.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute has arisen between the Auckland Saddlers, Harness-makers, Collar-makers, and Bridle-cutters' Industrial Union of Workers and the Auckland Saddlery Company, Victoria Street, Auckland, and others: the following are the recommendations of the Conciliation Council:—

Hours of Work.

1. The hours of work shall be forty-eight in each week. On Saturdays in each week the hours of work shall expire not later than 1 p.m., except in districts where the statutory half-holiday is on any other day of the week, when the hours of work shall expire not later than 1 p.m. on that day. All time worked beyond the time mentioned in this clause or on holidays shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first three hours, time and a half for the next three hours, double time after midnight, on any days except the days mentioned in clause 10 hereof, on which days, including
