WHEREAS by an Order in Council issued on the second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, under the authority of section one hundred and sixty-nine of the Land Act, 1892, fixing the terms and conditions of lease upon which lands in certain village settlements should be disposed of, it was provided that no lessee should hold more than one allotment in the Tutakara Village Settlement :
