3. To provide that the said trustees shall exercise the said powers of sale, exchange, and mortgage only by authority

of the General Synod.

4. To continue the said Acts of 1858 and 1868 and the Bishops in New Zealand Trusts Act, 1871, between the commencement of the Statutes Repeal Act, 1907, and the proposed Act.
