*Land reserved under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

SCHEDULE.

TEPURE RIVER BANK.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, containing by admeasurement 7 acres 3 roods 30 perches, more or less, being Section 21, Block XII, Kaitieke Survey District. Bounded towards the north generally by a river-bank reserve 1 chain wide along Tepure River; towards the east by Crown lands, 440 links; towards the south-east and again towards the east by Main Trunk Road, 345 links and 29.1 links respectively; towards the south by Section 22, Block XII,

Kaitieke Survey District, 1086.3 links; and towards the south-west, west, and again towards the south-west by Main Trunk Road, 369.9 links, 230.2 links, and 100 links respectively: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less: as the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 719/1, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honourable Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Member of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over His Majesty's Dominion of New Zealand and its Dependencies; and issued under the Seal of the said Dominion, at the Government House, at Wellington, this sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
