The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but to raise it at Christohuroh.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 621, against 605 in April—an increase of 16. The deaths in May were 258—an increase of 27 as compared with last month. Of the total deaths, males contributed 124, females 134. Forty-one of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 15.89 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under one year of age.

There were 90 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 76 in April. The following table shows the classification:—
