The salaries for teachers are fixed in accordance with the above scale, with the following exceptions:-

(1.) The salaries are not to be lowered on account of a fall in the grade of the day-school, although in such a case increments would cease.

(2.) For extra duties imposed outside ordinary school duties, board and residence for the teacher himself (or an additional £24 a year if not resident) is given.

(3.) The minimum annual salary for a male assistant teacher with full certificate is Grade $\frac{2B}{3A}$ (£135, rising to £165)
