PROPOSED LIGHT ON KARORI ROCK, COOK STRAIT.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 20th October, 1913.

NOTICE is hereby given that the New Zealand Government have authorized the building of a lighthouse on Karori Rock in Cook Strait, and the preliminaries in connection with building have been commenced. It is expected that the construction of the light will be completed and the light exhibited about June, 1914.

The light is to be an *unwatched acetone flash* light of 2,790 candle-power, at a height of 65 ft. above H.W. Flash $\frac{1}{2}$ second, and eclipse $3\frac{1}{2}$ seconds, and it should be visible for a distance of 14 miles.
