RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE FOR TE KUITI BOROUGH SEWERAGE CONNECTIONS LOAN OF £1,000.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1908, and the several amendments thereof respectively, and of every other power in that behalf enabling it, the Te Kuiti Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:
