ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of November, 1913.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section forty-seven of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, with respect to any public domain, appoint any local authority to be a Domain Board having, subject to Part II of the said Act, control of such domain:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the seventeenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and five, certain powers were delegated to the Alexandra Town Belt Domain Board for a period of seven years:

And whereas the period for which the said Board was appointed expired on the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve:

And whereas it appears expedient to again appoint a Domain Board to control the domain:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby appoint

to be the Alexandra Town Belt Domain Board, having control of the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and doth hereby appoint Monday, the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, at eight

ALEXANDRA TOWN BELT DOMAIN.

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, containing by admeasurement 157 acres, more or less, being Town Belt, Town of Alexandra. Regulations as to Issue of Licenses to take Trout, Perch, and Tench.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, this tenth day of November, 1913.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section eighty-three of the Fisheries Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations for, amongst other things, providing for the issue of licenses to take fish or specified kinds of fish, the mode of applying for and conditions of such licenses, and the fee to be paid in respect thereto:

And whereas it is desirable to make a regulation to provide that no acclimatization society shall canvass for or issue licenses outside the boundary of its district:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the hereinbefore-recited power and authority, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. ACCLIMATIZATION societies shall only issue licenses at places within the boundaries of their own district, and no society shall canvass or seek to induce any person outside its district to take a license from it.

2. Any society committing a breach of the above regulation is liable to a fine not exceeding £50.

Tuatara Lizard absolutely protected.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do by this notification declare that the lizard known as tuatara (*Sphenodon punctatum*) shall be protected absolutely throughout the said Dominion.
