**I**N pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Matamata County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of one thousand two hundred pounds (£1,200), (being 10 per cent. additional on a loan of twelve thousand pounds authorized to be raised by a poll of ratepayers taken on the 19th day of October, 1912, the said loan of £12,000 having proved insufficient), for the purpose of completing the work of improving the grades and metalling certain portions of the following roads:—

- Main road, from the Gordon-Waharoa Junction to the Patetere boundary;
