RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Kawhia County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £2,000, authorized to be raised by the Kawhia County Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of widening and metalling portion of the Pirongia West Road from the junction of the Okupata Road to Section 1, Block 1, Pirongia S.D., the said Kawhia County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Pirongia West Special-rating Area, comprising Sections 1 and 2, Block IV, Kawhia North S.D.; Section 1 and the southern portions of Sections 2 and 3, Block I, Pirongia S.D.; part Section 1 and the northern portions of Sections 2, 3, and 4, Block V, Pirongia S.D.; Section 1 and the northern portions of Sections 2 and 3, Block VIII, Kawhia North S.D.; Pirongia West No. 3B Section 2c No. 4 (part); Pirongia West No. 3B Section 2c No. 5; part of Pirongia West No. 3B Section 2c No. 3 (part); and Pirongia West No. 3B Section 2c No. 2; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the 17th day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of $36\frac{1}{2}$ years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
