Powers delegated to the Orari Gorge Scenic Board under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule below (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of three years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

ARTHUR JOHN BLAKISTON,
WILLIAM MCLEOD,
JAMES BURT,
ROBERT YATES, and
WILLIAM ALEXANDER HEWSON.

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Orari Gorge Scenic Board (herein referred to as "the Board"), in trust for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business in the Tripp Schoolhouse, at 7 p.m., on the first Saturday in every month, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held during the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.

3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
