WHEREAS the Governor is satisfied that the population of the Otals Town Principle W tion of the Otaki Town District, in the County of Horowhenua, exceeds five hundred, and the Town Board of the said Otaki Town District has made application that the said town district shall not form part of the County of Horowhenua, being the county within the boundaries of which it is situated

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Town Boards Amendment Act, 1908 (No. 2), and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that, on and after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, the Otaki Town District shall not form part of the County of Horowhenua.
