The services of the Medical Inspector appointed will be specially directed to the inspection of schools and school-children (and, when so required, of teachers employed in public schools), the inspection to be conducted on lines of method jointly approved by the Inspector-General of Schools and the Chief Health Officer.

6. It is an essential part of the duty of the Medical Inspector to take such steps as may be found possible to instruct and train teachers in charge of public schools in the methods of school inspection, and to give lectures to teachers as occasion arises on matters relating to the diseases of school life and sanitation, and generally to undertake any duties that the Ministers of the Departments concerned consider necessary in the furtherance of the work for which they have been ap-

pointed.
7. The Inspector will be required to advise the Education Department and the Public Health Department on all matters relating to school hygiene, including the health of the children, whether normal or otherwise.

8. The officer appointed will be under the direct control of the Chief Health Officer in consultation with the Inspector-General of Schools.
