

thence along the western side of the road forming the western boundary of that section and of Sections Nos. 14 and 12, Block XIII, to the north-eastern corner of Aorangi D Block; thence along the northern boundaries of Aorangi D, C, and B Blocks, the western boundary of the last-mentioned block, and part of the north-eastern boundary of Paeroa Township to the Rifle Range; thence along the northern boundary of the Rifle Range to a point in line with the western side of the road forming the western boundary of Section No. 8, Block XIII, Ohinemuri Survey District; thence to and along the western side of that road and the south-western side of the road forming the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 8, 10, 11, 13, and 142, Block XIII aforesaid, to the south-eastern corner of Orangi-pirau No. 2 Block; thence along the southern boundary of that block to the Awangarara Stream, along that stream to the Tarariki Stream, across and along the right bank of the Tarariki Stream to and across the Ohinemuri River, and along the left bank of that river to the south-eastern corner of Ouerangi Block; thence along the south-eastern boundary of that block, the south-eastern boundary of Pareroiroi Block, and that boundary produced to the railway from Paeroa to Waihi, and along the north-eastern side of that railway to Te Tawa Block; thence across the railway and along the southern boundary of the said Te Tawa Block to the easternmost corner of Te Manuka No. 2 Block; thence along the northern boundary of that block to the Kuaotiti Stream, along that stream, the south-western boundary of Koromatua No. 1A Block, and part of the south-western boundary of Parahamuti Block to the Te Aroha-Thames Road, across that road, and along its western side to Mill Road; thence along the north-eastern side of Mill Road to the south-western boundary of Otaotarahi Block; thence along that boundary to the Ohinemuri River, along the left bank of that river to its confluence with the Waihou River; thence across the Waihou River and along its left bank to a point opposite the mouth of the Te Tawa Stream; and thence across the Waihou River to the mouth of the Te Tawa Stream, the place of commencement.

The notice gazetted on the 25th day of November, 1909, fixing the closing-hours of all such shops in the borough is hereby varied accordingly.

BOROUGH OF NEW PLYMOUTH.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of New Plymouth was taken on the 22nd day of September, 1914, upon the proposal of the New Plymouth Borough Council to borrow by way of special loan the sum of £20,000 as hereafter mentioned:—

(a.) The particular purposes for which the loan is required are—to provide additions and extensions to the electric lighting, either within or without the borough, and to supply electricity; to acquire, in connection with such additions and extensions, lands, easements, and appurtenances and

buildings, engines and machinery, and other things; to pay compensation to any person injuriously affected, and any other purpose incidental to or in relation to any of the above purposes.

(b.) The sum to be borrowed for all of such purposes is £20,000, at a rate of interest not exceeding £5 per centum per annum, with a sinking fund of $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum additional.

(c.) The proposed security for the said loan of £20,000, and the interest and sinking fund thereon, is an annually recurring special rate of $\frac{3}{4}$ d. in the pound on the annual value of all rateable property in the said borough; and it is proposed to repay the money on the 1st day of April, 1933.

(d.) It is proposed to pay out of the loan the cost of raising the loan and the interest and sinking fund thereon for the first year.

The number of votes recorded for the proposal was 256. The number of votes recorded against the proposal was 75.

I therefore declare that the proposal was carried.

Proposal to raise a Special Loan.

We hereby give public notice that on the 24th day of September, 1914, the following proposal to raise a special loan under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, was submitted by the Timaru Borough Council to a poll of the ratepayers of the Borough of Timaru.

PROPOSAL.

(a.) The particular purpose for which the loan is required is for the formation and completion to their adopted levels of all streets in the Borough of Timaru which have not yet been so formed, particulars whereof have been open for inspection at the office of the Timaru Borough Council.

(b.) The sum proposed to be borrowed for such purpose is £10,000, having a currency not exceeding fifty years, and bearing interest not exceeding £5 per centum per annum, or such greater or lesser amount as may be required and may be allowed by law for the purposes of this loan, and for other purposes in relation thereto, prescribed by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, or either of them.

(c.) The proposed security is a special rate of 1d. in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual rateable value of all rateable property in the said borough, and the provision for repayment of the loan is a sinking fund of £1 per centum
