The inclusion of the suburban boroughs tends to lower the rate at Auckland and Dunedin, but raises it at Wellington and Christchurch.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 608, against 572 in May—an increase of 36. The deaths in June were 258—an increase of 33 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 142, females 116. Forty-nine of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 18.99 per cent. of the whole number; 39 of these were under one year of age.

There were 90 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 74 in May. The following table shows the classification:—
