Special Orders made by the Manukau County Council altering Boundaries of the Paparua, Pakuranga, and Howick Township Road Districts.

THE following special orders, made by the Manukau County Council, are published in accordance with the provisions of the Counties Act, 1908.

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 9 and 10 of the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Manukau County Council, on petition as required by section 9, and with the consent of the Paparua Road Board, and on the application of such Board as required by section 10, but subject to the conditions (a) and (b) of said section 10, resolves, by way of special order, as follows:—

1. On and after the 30th day of September, 1914, the Paparua Road District shall be altered by excluding therefrom the land described in the First Schedule hereto.

2. The boundaries of the said district as so altered shall be as described in the Second Schedule hereto.
