THE Auckland Harbour Board have notified that beacons have been erected at the eastern and western ends of the rock in mid-channel of the Tamaki River off the Panmure

The outer or easternmost beacon is diamond in shape and red in colour, and bears 150° (S. 45° E. magnetic) from the end of the wharf and distant 140 ft. The inner or westernmost beacon is triangular in shape and red in colour, and bears 251° (S. 56° W. magnetic) from the eastern beacon and distant 320 ft. The beacons mark the extreme cast and west points of the rock which shows just awash at L.W.S.T.
