ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of August, 1914.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section forty-seven of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, appoint any local authority to be a Domain Board having, subject to the said Act, control of any public domain :

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the sixteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, a Domain Board was appointed to control the Pudding Hill Domain :

And whereas the period for which the said Board was appointed expired on the fifteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen :

And whereas it appears expedient to again appoint a Domain Board to control the domain :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby appoint

THE ASHBURTON COUNTY COUNCIL

to be the Pudding Hill Domain Board, having the control of the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of and subject to the provisions of Part II of the said Act ; and doth hereby appoint Friday, the fourth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, at four o'clock p.m., as the time when, and the office of the County Council at Ashburton as the place where, the first meeting of the Board shall be held.

PUDDING HILL DOMAIN.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 87 acres 1 rood 28 perches, more or less, being reserve numbered 3743, Block VIII, Hutt Survey District.
