Additional Regulations under the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this eleventh day of October, 1915.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by section sixteen of the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby amend the regulations made under the said Act on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-first day of May then instant, in manner hereinafter set forth; and do hereby declare that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read with the said regulations of the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and shall come into force on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.
