PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that at a poll of the ratepayers of the City of Auckland taken on the 10th day of November, 1915, on the proposal of the Auckland City Council to borrow the sum of £10,000 for the extension of the water-supply in Grey Lynn Area of the City of Auckland, the number of votes recorded for the proposal was 1,682, and the number of votes recorded against the proposal was 393.

TAMAKI WEST ROAD BOARD.

Notice of Result of Poll on Proposal to raise Loan.

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, I hereby give notice that a poll of the ratepayers of the Tamaki West Road District was taken on the 15th day of October, 1915, on a proposal to raise a special loan of £2,750 (two thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds) for road-improvements and other purposes in the said district, the purposes of such proposal being fully set forth in the *New Zealand Herald* of the 16th, 23rd, and 30th September, and 7th October, being a newspaper circulating in the said district.
