Notice fixing the Closing-hours of Tobacconists' Shops in the City of Dunedin, under the Shops and Offices Act.

WHEREAS a requisition in writing, signed by a majority of the occupiers of all the tobacconists' shops in the City of Dunedin, has been forwarded to me, desiring that all such shops in the city shall be closed in the evening of working-days as follows: At 8 p.m. on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and 9 p.m. on Friday of each week, with the exceptions (1) of Christmas and New Year weeks, commencing in each case on the Monday immediately prior to Christmas Day and New Year's Day; (2) of the week of midwinter show; and (3) that any shopkeeper whose shop is closed for the whole of any day which is generally observed as a public holiday in the city may keep open on the preceding working-day evening until 11 p.m.:

And whereas the Dunedin City Council has certified that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the tobacconists' shops within the City of Dunedin:

Now, therefore, I, William Ferguson Massey, Minister of Labour, in pursuance of section 25 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, do hereby direct that from and after the 17th day of December, 1915, all tobacconists' shops in the City of Dunedin shall be closed in accordance with such requisition.

The notice gazetted on the 4th day of June, 1915, fixing the closing-hours of tobacconists' shops in the city is hereby cancelled accordingly.
