OMAKA ROAD BOARD.

Special Order.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act, 1909, and by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Omapa Road Board hereby resolves by way of special order as follows:—

That, for the purpose of raising the Omapa Road Board's contribution to the Wairau Hospital and Charitable Aid Board for the erection of a new hospital, the Omapa Road Board hereby authorizes the raising of a special loan of one thousand pounds (£1,000) for the term of five years. That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on such loan, the said Omapa Road Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one fifty-fourth of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property in the Omapa Road District; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring
