Amending General Regulations under Part II of the Fisheries Act, 1908.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twelfth day of April, 1915.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 76, of the twenty-ninth day of the same month, general regulations were made for fishing for trout and perch:

And whereas it is desirable to add to and amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional and amending regulations for the purposes of the said Act, and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall have force and effect in each Acclimatization District throughout the Dominion.

REGULATIONS.

1. No license for taking trout or perch shall authorize any person to fish with more than one rod and line.
