

Member appointed Pongaroa Scenic Board.

WHEREAS by a Warrant dated the twenty-second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of that month, the control of certain land in the Wellington Land District known as the Pongaroa Scenic Reserve was vested in certain persons therein named, who were by the said Warrant constituted a special Board by the name of the Pongaroa Scenic Board, in pursuance of section thirteen of the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908: And whereas the name of Francis Herbert, farmer, of Pongaroa, was omitted from the said Warrant:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby declare that the name of the said Francis Herbert shall be deemed to have been included in the said Warrant as from the date thereof, and the said Francis Herbert shall be deemed to be and to have been a member of the Pongaroa Scenic Board from that date accordingly.
