And whereas the Christchurch City Council, the local authority having control of the street described in the Schedule hereto, has passed the following resolution—viz., "That the Christchurch City Council, being the local authority having control of Radnor Street, St. Albans Ward, of the City of Christchurch, hereby resolves that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to the said street" :

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved, subject to the condition hereinafter mentioned :

And whereas the Mornington Borough Council, the local authority having control of the portion of street described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said portion of street") has passed the following resolution—viz., "That the Mornington Borough Council do hereby resolve that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to that portion of District Road fronting Sections 15, 16, and 17, Block VI, Belleknoves, in the Borough of Mornington, as shown on the attached plan" :

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far only as it refers to the south-eastern side of the said portion of street, subject to the condition hereinafter mentioned :
