Approving the Ashburton Belgian Relief Association Fund under the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 under to (No. 2).

- (a.) For the relief of distress occasioned by the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, whether such distress exists in New Zealand or elsewhere in the British Dominions, or in any country allied to

the British Dominions, or in any country allied to His Majesty;

(b.) For any patriotic objects approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor:

Provided that every such contribution is paid either—

(1.) Into a public fund established by the Government, or by any local authority, for the purposes of such relief of distress, or patriotic objects; or

(2.) Into a fund established by persons other than the Government or a local authority, where such fund and the conditions of control and expenditure thereof are approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor: by the Governor:

And whereas certain persons in the Provincial District of Canterbury have formed themselves into an association known as the Ashburton Belgian Relief Association for the

following purposes, namely:—
(a.) To provide from the Town and County of Ashburton food, clothing, and money, and other relief and comfort for such of the people and subjects of the Kingdom of Belgium as have suffered distress in or
