## RESOLUTION MAKING A SPECIAL RATE.

Resolution Making a Special Rate.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Masterton County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and annual charges on a loan of £400, authorized to be raised by the Masterton County Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of completing the construction of headworks and distributing-races in the Te Oreore Water-supply District, the said Masterton County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-sixth of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Te Oreore Water-supply Special-rating Area, comprising parts 1 and 3, Ahitainga No. 1; part Okurupatu No. 1; Lot A, Lots 2a Nos. 2, 3, and 4, of Okurupatu No. 3; part Te Ahitainga N.R. 4c No. 1; Okurupatu 2a No. 2; Section 1s No. 1 and part No. 2; part Lot No. 3, Te Oreore Estate, Section 2, Te Oreore Estate; Lots 11/17, parts 20 and 22, Te Oreore Estate; parts 14/39 of Sections 8 and 13, 72 N.; part Te Oreore No. 1; Te Ahitainga; Te Ahitainga N.R. 4a No. 1; Subdivisions 3 and 4, Te Oreore Estate; and Lot 3c of 3, Te Oreore Estate: all in Block 1, Otahoua Survey District. And that such special rate shall be an annual-reourring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of February and the 1st day recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 5 years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

### RESOLUTION.

Mr. Ewen Campbell, the Chairman of the Club and the meeting, moved, and Mr. Gifford Marshall seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to :-

## WANGANUI JOCKEY CLUB.

# REGULATIONS.

## (Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Wanga-nui Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the follwoing regulations controlling the admission of persons to the Wanganui Racecourse situate at Wanganui while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club

while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the part of the said Wanganui Racecourse Reserve while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the

Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated with the Racing Conference of New Zealand.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the Wanganui Jockey Club were made and passed by the Wanganui Jockey Club on the
