TAURANGA COUNTY COUNCIL.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE AS SECURITY FOR A SPECIAL LOAN OF £600.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Tauranga County Council resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £600, authorized to be raised by the Tauranga County Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for grading and metalling main roads in the Katikati Riding of the County of Tauranga, the said Tauranga County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-eighth of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property in the Katikati Riding; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 36½ years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TAKE LAND.
