REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf con tained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Westport Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act, and hereinafter referred to as "the said club," doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Racecourse Reserve situate at Mill Street, Westport, and set apart for racing purposes, and known as the Westport Trotting Course, while the same is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "trotting clubs," and "race meetings" shall have the meanings ascribed to them by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

- (c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
