THE following regulations were laid before the members of the South Wairarapa Trotting Club at a meeting held on the 28th day of May, 1917, at Greytown, with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. C. J. Beard, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. C. J. Beard, the Chairman of the Club and of the meeting, moved, "That it be and hereby is resolved that such regulations be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof."

The motion was seconded by Mr. A. McPhee, and carried.

The following are the regulations above referred to:—

SOUTH WAIRARAPA TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the South Wairarapa Trotting Club, a trotting club within the meaning of the said Act (and hereafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse reserve situate at Moroa, Greytown, and set apart for racing purposes, and known as the South Wairarapa Trotting Club Racecourse, while the same is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "trotting club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and hereby are excluded from the said racecourse while the same is used or occupied by the said club for racing purposes, namely:—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Trotting Association.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the South Wairarapa Trotting Club were made and adopted by the said club at its meeting held on the 28th day of May, 1917, and signed by
