KAWHIA BAR BEACONS.

Marine Department, Wellington, N.Z., 5th September, 1917.

OTICE has been received from the Kawhia Harbour authorities that the Kawhia Bar has shifted to the south, and the channel is now nearly the same as it occupied prior to May, 1910 (see Notice No. 49, of July, 1908).

The leading-beacons which were erected in July, 1908, have been established and painted white—viz., the front beacon on the rock off South Head and the back beacon on the western extreme of Te Motu Island. These beacons in line bear 121½° (S. 74° E. magnetic), and lead over the bar in 17 ft. M.L.W.S. The width of the channel is about

1½ cables.

The beacon on the sandbank to seaward of Te Motu Island

When about two cables inside the bar, vessels must haul one and a quarter points to the eastward, and continue on this course till outer point of South Head (Urawitiki Point) is abeam, then steer through the centre of channel between the
