## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO TAKE LAND.

In the matter of the Public Works Act, 1908, and the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and their amendments.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the City of Wellington proposes, under the provisions of the above-named Acts, and all other Acts and powers enabling it in that behalf, to execute a certain public work—namely, the widening of the main Karori Road; and for the purpose of such public works the lands described in the Schedule hereto are required to be taken. 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## ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE PHARMACY BOARD OF NEW ZEALAND.
