RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Marlborough Racing Club at a meeting held on the 31st day of July, 1917, at Blenheim, with a recommenda-tion by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. H. D. Vavasour, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor-General, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. H. D. Vavasour, the Chairman of the Club and the Meeting, moved, and Mr. Waddy seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to :-

MARLBOROUGH RACING CLUB. REGULATIONS

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf con-In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf con-tained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Marl-borough Racing Club, a racing elub within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admis-sion of persons to that part of the raceocurse reserve situate in the Dictivit of Ometra and Imourn as the Riceal Race in the District of Omaka, and known as the Riverlands Race course, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the same meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely :

(a.) Bookmakers.
