WAIPUKURAU JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Waipukurau Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to the said club's racecourse situated at Waipukurau, owned by the said club, and situated at Waipukurau, and known as the Waipukurau Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the Waipukurau Jockey Club's Racecourse while the same is being used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

- (a.) Bookmakers, bookmakers' clerks, betting agents, and layers of starting-prices, and all persons who have been guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connection with racing or betting, or have been warned off any racecourse by any racing club.
- (b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference.
- (c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations were adopted at a duly constituted meeting of the Waipukurau Jockey Club held at Waipukurau on Monday, the 30th July, 1917.

KIRIKIROA ROAD BOARD.

RUAKURA SPECIAL-RATING AREA.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Kirikiriroa Road Board hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a supplementary loan of £100, authorized to be raised by the Kirikiriroa Road Board, under section 18 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of the completion of the roads in the Ruakura Special-rating Area, being ten per cent. of the original loan of £1,000 authorized to be raised by the said Kirikiriroa Road Board for roading purposes in the Ruakura Special-rating Area, as gazetted in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 11th day of June, 1914, at page 2425, the Kirikiriroa Road Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-tenth of a penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property in the Ruakura Special-rating Area; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the first days of February and August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 36½ years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
