WHEREAS by section forty of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, with respect to any public domain, appoint such persons (not exceeding nine) as he thinks fit to be a Domain Board having, subject to Part II of the said Act, control of such domain :

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the seventh day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the seventeenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten, a Domain Board was appointed to control the Hororata Domain :

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amend-ment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor-General in Council underthat Act: And whereas James Stewart (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines along the route defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called " the said electric lines," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect therefor under the said section : a license in respect thereof under the said section ;

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under In the Schedule heredo, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for lighting, power, and hereina numerous heating purposes.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE ROUTE OF THE ELECTRIC LINES AUTHORIZED.

THAT route across Awaroa Road, in the Township of Helens-THAT route across Awaroa Road, in the Township of Helens-ville, near the corner of Awaroa Road and Garfield Street, connecting the engine-house and site of picture palace in the Otamateanui Block, part of 1581 (red), Block XIV, Kaipara Survey District. As the said route is more particularly delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 42517, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington, and thereon shown by double black lines. lines.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in para-graph (a) (1) of clause 2 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 110 to 120

volts between the terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.
