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WAITARA BOROUGH COUNCIL.

THE following resolution to make and levy a special rate was passed at a special meeting of the Waitara Borough Council held on Monday, 26th November, 1917:—

In pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Waitara Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest, sinking fund, and other charges on a loan of fifteen hundred pounds (£1,500), authorized to be raised by the Waitara Borough Council, under the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, for the purpose of re-erecting damaged bridge over the Waitara River at Waitara known as the "Waitara Traffic-bridge," the Waitara Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-ninth of a penny in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property in the Borough of Waitara, comprising the whole of the said borough; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of December in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and a half years (36½), or until the loan is fully paid off.
