THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by section eight of the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth modifying the provisions of the Education Act, 1914, to meet conditions arising out of the present war, respecting-

- I. (a.) The appointment, payment, transfer, and removal of temporary teachers in public and Native schools, and the conditions on which such teachers may become contributors to the Teachers' Superannuation Fund;
  - (b.) The appointment of teachers who may be members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force; and
  - (c.) The staffing of public and Native schools, and the adjustment of the salaries payable to teachers and others employed in such schools:

## REGULATIONS.

- I. APPOINTMENT AND PAYMENT OF TEACHERS, AND STAFFING OF SCHOOLS.
