#### DEATHS AND DEATH-RATES.

The total number of deaths registered for the four centres in 1916 was 3,275—viz., 2,734 in the cities, and 541 in the suburbs.

By including the suburbs the death-rate for last year is lowered at all of the four centres. The rates for the year are,—

Again, the percentage of deaths of children under five years to the total number of deaths is—Auckland, 20.44; Wellington, 23.75; Christchurch, 19.58; Dunedin, 14.87.

Excluding suburbs, and dealing with the deaths at all ages in the four cities or central boroughs only, the rates for 1916 are found to be higher than in the previous year in all cases except that of Wellington. The figures for five years are given :—
