NOBEL COMMITTEE OF THE NORWEGIAN PARLIAMENT. Nobel Peace Prize.

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize,

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1917, must. in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February of the same year. Any one of the following persons is held to be duly quali-fied: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Com-mittee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize. The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.
