At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of March, 1917.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section fourteen of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, a petition was presented to the Governor praying that part of the Avonside Riding of the County of Heathcote should be excluded from the said county and included in the City of Christehureh:

And whereas a commission, appointed under the said section, held an inquiry, and reported that the area described in the Schedule hereto should be included in the City of Christehurch:

And whereas it is expedient that the said area should be included in the said City of Christchurch:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth borraby dealers that as on and from the twentich day of March. hereby declare that as on and from the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be included in the City of Christchurch, and shall form part of the Linwood Ward thereof; and that the boundaries of the said Linwood Ward shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Area included in City of Christchurch.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of Dudley Creek with the River Avon, thence across that river and along its right bank to the western side of Kerrs Road, along the western side of that road and of New Brighton Road to Woodham or Mile Road, and thence along the present boundary of the City of Christchurch to Dudley Creek, the place of com-

SECOND SCHEDULE.

LINWOOD WARD.

ALL that area in the City of Christchurch bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of Dudley Creek with the commencing at the connuence of Dudley Creek with the River Avon, thence across that river and along its right bank to the western side of Kerrs Road, along the western side of that road and of New Brighton Road to Buckley Road, along the north-western side of that road to and across Linwood Avenue, along the south-eastern side of Aldwin's Road and its production to the south-western side of Ferry Road, and along the south western side of Formy Road to Road, and along the south-western side of Ferry Road to Ensor's Road, thence along the south-eastern side of that road to the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway Reserve, the north-eastern side of that reserve to and across Wilson's Road, along the north-western side of that road to Ferry Road, along the southern side of that road to Fitzgerald Avenue, along the eastern side of that avenue to and across the River Avon, and along the left bank of that river to Dudley Creek, the place of commencement.

AREA INCLUDED IN THE CITY OF CHRISTCHURCH.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a the trace in the Canterbury Land District bounded by a line commencing on the left bank of the Heathcote River at the bridge between Tennyson Street and Burnbrae Street, thence across the said river and along the northern side of Burnbrae Street to and across St. Martin's Road, along the eastern side of that road to and along the northern side of Hills Road to the watercourse about midway between Heathcot and Victoria Streets and along the said watercourse to cote and Victoria Streets, and along the said watercourse to and across the Heathcote River, and thence along the present

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SYDENHAM WARD.

ALL that area in the City of Christchurch bounded by a line along the southern side of Moorhouse Avenue from Lower Lincoln Road to Fitzgerald Avenue, along the eastern side of Fitzgerald Avenue to Ferry Road, along the southern side of Ferry Road to Wilson's Road, the western side of Wilson's Road to the reserve for the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway, Road to the reserve for the Christchurch-Lyttelton Railway, along the north-eastern side of that reserve to the River Heathcote, along the left bank of that river to a point opposite the watercourse from Hills Road near Heathcote Street, thence across the river and along the said watercourse to Hills Road, along the northern side of Hills Road to and along the eastern side of St. Martin's Road to a point opposite the northern side of Burnbrae Street, thence to and along the northern side of that street to the Tennyson Street Bridge, thence across the Heathcote River and along its left. Bridge, thence across the Heathcote River and along its left bank to Colombo Street, along the eastern side of that street to Stickland Street, along the north-eastern side of Stickland Street, the northern side of South Crescent Road, the northern side of Jerrold Street, and the north-eastern side of Bright's Road to Lower Lincoln Road, and along the south-eastern side of that road to Moorhouse Avenue, the place of commencement.
